Dear families

Following a ballot of its members, the National Union of Education Union (NEU) has announced a series of strikes, which might affect Linden Lodge on the following dates:

- Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February
  Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March
- Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March
- Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March

It is our intention to remain open on those dates. However, staff shortages due to strike action, may mean that we will be unable to deliver our normal provision. The options we will be looking at are not limited to, but will include:

- merging classes
- having activity-based days

 restricting attendance to vulnerable children and/or children of critical workers

• closing the school

Limiting attendance, or closing the school is a last resort and will only happen if we are unable to provide safe staffing levels.

It is important that you are aware that there is a strong possibility that the normal school day will be disrupted on strike days, we will do everything we can to ensure that the impact is minimised. We are currently working to understand the implications and consider the best way forward and will be in touch as soon as possible to outline our planned approach.

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
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Harp class have also been enjoying their horse riding sessions this term.
