Museum in a box



As part of a research project making imaging and analysis of artefacts at the Natural History Museum more accessible to visually impaired individuals, students in Minerva have been exploring 'Museum in a box'

In this introductory session, students tried different cards on the device, and listened to audios describing events in history such as the launch of the Apollo 11 in 1969, and an audio of 'I Love You' by Ella Fitzgerald. The feedback from students will be forwarded to the Natural History Museum for them to develop further.

Students and adults had a great time celebrating with friends, singing the national anthem, wearing crowns and showing off our art work.







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News from the Habilitation Team

The King's Coronation

The King's Coronation to be broadcast with live accessible commentary and audio description. The coronation of King Charles will be an occasion to bring the country together. The coronation of King Charles III will be broadcast with live accessible commentary on the red button on BBC1 and live audio description on ITV1 on Saturday 6th of May.

How to watch?

BBC1

The event will be broadcast live on BBC1 and blind and partially sighted people will be able to join in through a synchronised accessible commentary on the BBC red button or catch up on iPlayer. This type of accessible commentary is different to audio description. Whilst audio description has traditionally been pre-recorded and mixed into the main audio after filming, this accessible commentary will be transmitted live as the event happens.

ITV1

The Coronation will be broadcast with live audio description on ITV1. This will be the very first broadcast on UK TV with live audio description so a moment in itself to celebrate. Viewers will be able to switch the audio description on in the usual way by pressing the AD/ audio description button on the remote control.

This is the very first time that a live programme on UK TV will be made accessible for viewers with sight loss. ITV and BBC are using pioneering methods to deliver live AD which could become blueprints for future events.

The PE team have been strongly focused on further developing our provision. Ramona, PE Teacher, has attended the latest round of rebound therapy training. Hannie, our PE assistant has completed her own CPD with the Special Olympics and undertaken the Motor Activity Training Programme course online, connecting with experts working at the highest levels of sport for people with intellectual and physical disabilities. The department are very excited to use this knowledge to expand and improve PE lessons for our PMLD students and beyond.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone who has supported the PE department this week and ask that we all are mindful about how our children and young people are staying active or engaging in physical activity in their own way.


