Learning at Linden

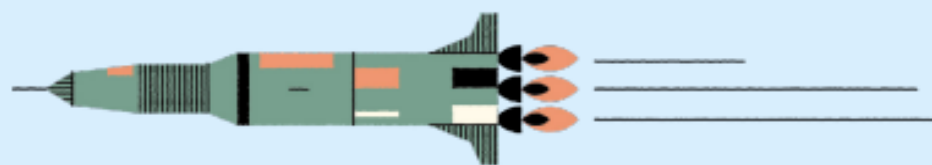
Students in Minerva 2 are working on the topic "adventures" and were asked to write about a place they would like to visit.
