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

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
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# Maths Workshop

You are invited to attend an online Maths workshop on Thursday 7 December at 11am, where we shall cover:


- How children learn to count

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# STORIES SHARED: AAC AT LINDEN LODGE



### Always Presume Competence

"We had been using paper based AAC with a student for a long time and eventually decided to trial a battery powered option. I was hesitant in the students ability to transfer the skills, but when the device was presented to him, he used it straight away and then looked at me as if to say 'what took you so long'."

### Importance of Motivation

"I had been supporting a student to make requests during desktop activities and it took ages for her to request for one toy. Took her to McDonalds and she used her communication board to order a burger, chips and a milkshake in less than 30 seconds. It was that day that I realised how important motivation truly was."

### Remember - This is the Students Voice

"We introduced the word and concept of a 'party' to a student using her device. She went to a different class to celebrate her friends birthday party and had a great time! For weeks afterwards the student continually requested for a 'party' and the adults in her class had to explain to her that she couldn't have a party everyday! They had the same conversation multiple times a day, just as they would if she was using her voice to ask!"





### Enjoy the Funny Moments

"We were looking at pictures of my wedding and I was asking the student to use her eye-gaze to give me her opinion, she called my new husband 'boring' and I had a great laugh with her and told her I thought he looked boring as well!"

#### Empowerment

"It's been great to see how a student who previously couldn't express what they wanted make choices now by using the 'more' and 'finished' symbols."



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




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# National Occupational Therapy Week—6th –12th November 2023



### What is Occupational Therapy?

Occupational Therapy focuses on supporting children's access in all areas of life, such as learning, play and engagement. It also helps with developing independence in activities of daily living. Some areas that OT covers within the school setting:

Class seating to optimise access to learning activities Slings for hoisting Upper limb function and Hand splints Independence in ADLs such as toileting, feeding, tooth brushing, dressing etc. Supporting sensory needs Facilitating development of Emotional Regulation 2023 OT week asks about "OCCUPATIONS" & why they matter?

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
